



New Promotion Regulations for PUC applicable to the students of 2013-14 batch onwards:

S.No.	Regulations	
1	Promotion from PUC to B.Tech 1 st year	Pass with 6 CGPA and with 50% (D grade) in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry subjects and pass in English & Telugu with at least 5 CGPA at the end of 2 nd year PUC including remedials will be promoted to E1
2	Re-registration or Remedial registration	<ul style="list-style-type: none">a) Such students who could not fulfil the promotion criteria from PUC to B.Tech 1st year will have an opportunity to re register or to write remedial examination including in Summer Semester.b) Re-registered students shall write both internal assessment test for 40% marks and for 60% marks end semester testc) Remedial students shall write only end semester test for 60% marks. Internal assessment for 40% marks be carried over from the internal assessment test held already. No separate internal assessment test will be held for this category.d) A maximum of two chances for remedial per subject shall be given.e) All remedial and grade improvement examinations should be conducted only in SUM semesters.f) The student is allowed to write remedial examinations in any number of subjects.
3	PUC completion certificate (for those who want exit at end of PUC II year)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">a) Minimum pass marks required in each subject is 40% (P-Grade)b) Students with a pass (40% - P grade) in all the subjects but with a CGPA of more than or equal to 5.00 can either exit with a PUC pass certificate or can repeat PUC to improve his/her grades to become eligible for promotion to E1.c) The readmitted/repeat students have to pay the mess charges as applicable.

		<p>d) Student may be given chance to improve their grades in SUM semesters to become eligible for promotion to E1.</p> <p>e) If they fail to do so, they may have to repeat PUC in the following year. Otherwise, they may exit.</p> <p>f) First two years of 6 year integrated B. Tech program should be completed within a maximum period of 3 years.</p>
4	Promotion from P1 to P2	<p>(a) A student with a CGPA of ≥ 5.00 will be promoted from P1 to P2.</p> <p>(b) All students with a CGPA < 5.00 have to repeat P1.</p> <p>(c) Student may be given chance to improve their grades in SUM semesters to become eligible for promotion to P2.</p> <p>(d) If they fail to do so, they may be asked to repeat P1 in the following year on payment of mess charges.</p>
5	Summer remedial programme and grade improvement	<p>All the students are permitted to attend remedial programme during Summer semester to improve their grades</p> <p>(a) Those students with $< 50\%$ (D Grade) in any subject are given 2 chances</p> <p>(b) Those students with $\geq 50\%$ (D Grade) in any subject will have one chance.</p> <p>(c) The best grade obtained among all the examination taken in a given subject will be included in final marks sheet and for calculation of final CGPA.</p> <p>(d) The student is allowed to write remedial examinations in any number of subjects.</p>
6	Remedial Education for the students at risk	<p>(a) Students are required to have a minimum of 4 SGPA in P1Sem1 for registration into P1sem2.</p> <p>(b) On successful completion of remedial programme he /she will be permitted to continue P1 Sem2 in the following year.</p>
